



Lesson 9 Local Church Automomy



Introduction


Why study this topic?

- 1. The **autonomy** of the local church is one of God's **safeguards**.
- 2. God has given this to His people to prevent us from digressing into apostasy.
- 3. An **understanding** of this topic is **essential** to keeping the local church **pure**.



What is Autonomy?

- 1. Simply, it is **self-rule**, independence or self-government.
- 2. The *scriptural* plan is that *each congregation* has its own biblically prescribed government.
- Under this plan, no outside pressure is exerted on the decisions made by the leadership of each church.




What is Autonomy?

- 4. Each local church is subject to only one higher authority, **Jesus Christ Himself.**
- 5. He is the head of the church and the only One who can tell the church what to do.

Matt 28:18

"And Jesus came up and spoke to them, saying, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth."

- 6. There is but one level of authority above a congregation, the **Head**, **Jesus Christ**.
- 7. There is **not** a **head** in heaven and a **head** on **earth**.




The Local church

1. The *local church* (congregation) is the *only* functioning organization of the Lord's people.

Phil 1:1

"Paul and Timothy, bondservants of Jesus Christ, To all the saints in Christ Jesus who are in Philippi, with the bishops and deacons" NKJV

- 2. The **Bishops** (called elders) are the **spiritual leaders**.
- 3. The **Deacons** are **servants** meeting the needs of the local church at the direction of the **elders**.
- 4. The **Saints** are the **Christians or disciples** of the local congregation.




Limits to Elders' Authority

- According to God's word, an eldership only has the authority to oversee one congregation - and never more than one.
- 2. Here is Peter's statement:

1 Peter 5:2-3

- 2 "Shepherd the flock of God which is among you, serving as overseers, not by compulsion but willingly, not for dishonest gain but eagerly;" 3 "nor as being lords over those entrusted to you, but being examples to the flock;" NKJV
- 3. Key phrase = among you
- 4. The *authority* of the elders is thus limited.




Limits to Elders' Authority

1. Here is Paul's statement:

Acts 20:28

"Therefore take heed to yourselves and to all the flock, among which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to shepherd the church of God which He purchased with His own blood". NKJV

- 2. This was a different eldership (Ephesian elders)
- 3. This is a different NT writer
- 4. What's the point?
- 5. Holy Spirit consistency!!



Limits to Elders' Authority


1. Here is another of Paul's statements:

1 Thess 5:12-13

12 But we request of you, brethren, that you appreciate those who <u>diligently</u> labor among you, and <u>have charge</u> over you in the Lord and give you instruction,


13 and that you esteem them very highly in love because of their work. Live in peace with one another. NAS

- 2. This passage was written to the church.
- 3. The previous passages were written to elders.
- 4. The ones to be **esteemed and highly appreciated** were those who *"labor among you"*.



Limits to Elders' Authority

- 1. The authority of elders is also *limited* in that they must rule within the parameters of *God's word*.
- 2. They must not **go beyond** what is **written** (1 Cor 4:6)
- Elders do exercise their authority in the realm of judgement decisions that must be made in the local church.
- 4. They do not have law giving authority.
- 5. They must be content to **remain inside** the **doctrine of Christ**.
- Like any other saint, if they wander outside of the NT, they "do not have God".




Limits to Elders' Authority

Areas of Judgement

Elders Can Decide:

- Who will be the preacher
- Who will hold gospel meetings
- What time services will be held
- When to initiate church discipline
- Who will be used in worship svcs
- Other areas of personal judgement

Someone must make such decisions and God has given that authority to the elders.



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Areas of Truth/Doctrine

No Authority to Decide:

- The frequency of observing the Lord's supper
- Whether or not the church will use instruments of music
- If the church has a gym or fellowship hall
- Whether there will be public prayers in worship

These doctrinal decisions are a matter of revelation from God, not judgements in areas of opinion that do not matter.





Some Applications

Modern Denominationalism

- Centralized power/authority
- Developed different forms of church government
- Many man-made denominations
- Develops its own ideas
- Some larger or smaller than a local church
- Separate "Sunday School" with its own officers, funds & work
- Established regions, districts, synods, councils, headquarters
- Dictates policy to individual congregations




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
Sponsoring Church Arrangement

- Popular among "institutional" churches
- Man's wisdom negates God's congregational autonomy plan
- Many congregations pool funds to do a bigger work than any one local church can do
- Smaller churches send money to one big church; funds are placed under a "sponsoring church eldership" to disburse.
- The problem; a congregation cannot take upon itself a work it has no ability to support.



A Brotherhood Work?

- 1. It is **tempting** for brethren to want to do a "great work" for the brotherhood.
- 2. There is no such thing as a "brotherhood work".
- 3. The Bible teaches *just one duty of a Christian* in relation to the brotherhood.
- 4. It is found in <u>1 Pet 2:17</u>. "Honor all people. Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honor the king"
- 5. That's it! Just love the brotherhood!
- 6. Some brethren fail to see the **clear distinction** between the church and its **local** and **universal** sense.

Church Universal

Matt 16:18; Eph 1:22-23; Eph 5:23-27; Heb 12:23

There is only one

One is added to it (Acts 2:47)

Began on Pentecost (Acts 2)

Saint dies - still in it

No earthly organization

Cannot pool funds

Has no work

Church Local

Rom 16:16; 1 Cor 1:2 Col 4:15-16; Rev 2 & 3

There are many

One must join (Acts 9:26)


May begin at any time

Saint dies – no longer a part

Earthly organization (Phil 1:1)

Must pool funds (1 Cor 16;1-2)

Has work to do



The Universal and Local Church

- 1. The NT scriptures are *completely silent* as to any universal function of the church.
- 2. Since God has given the church only a *local* organization, the congregation, He intended for its function and work to be executed through the *local church only*.
- 3. The local church does not have to answer to anyone except the Lord.
- 4. If we attempt to do differently, we become disobedient and irreverent.
